<b>Handwashing, toilets, showers</b>	
<p>Identify places for public access to safe sanitation and hygiene.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> <a href="#">Create a directory of local public buildings</a> with bathrooms, sinks and/or showers that could be made available to disaster survivors and volunteers.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Include handwashing plans in all volunteer work. Provide soap!</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Include a bathroom / sanitation plans in response efforts.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Share models for safe sanitation with impacted households, especially those that are more remote and can't travel to public restrooms.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Remind everyone interacting with mucking and grey water to wash their hands BEFORE and AFTER going to the bathroom.</li> </ul> <p>Safe sanitation when there is not running water or septic requires a plan to remove and treat waste</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Establish a safe dumping area at least 50 ft from any wells or waterways, ideally lined or contained to promote thermodynamic composting (heat) and reduce spreading.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Establish a designated area for emergency toilets with handwashing.</li> </ul>	<p><b>DIY handwashing station</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Use clean water (from a hose), but not potable water when possible</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Make small holes in the lid of a plastic drink bottle and squeeze the bottle to dispense water.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Purchase water containers with a side spigot, or <a href="#">build them</a>.</li> </ul> <p><b>DIY toilets</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> For short-term use, all you need is a bucket with a lid and dry material like sawdust, wood shavings or wood chips. Or, build a <a href="#">composting toilet box</a>.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Stock with period products and toilet paper</li> </ul> <p><b>DIY showers</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Use a 5 gallon bucket and a scoop (smaller bucket or empty yogurt container) to pour water over your head in your current shower/tub. If indoor options are not available, designate a well-draining, firm surface for outdoor showering. Provide privacy using a tarp, sheet, etc.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> There are many outdoor gear/camp shower options for purchase</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> After flooding, rivers and lakes may not be safe to swim in. When it is safe, use biodegradable soap if washing in freshwater.</li> </ul>
<b>Laundry</b>	
<p>Identify places for public, low-cost and preferably free access to do laundry</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> <a href="#">Create a directory</a> of households, businesses and public spaces with washers and dryers</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Contact local churches and other orgs to set up free laundry services. <a href="#">Example here</a>.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Washers/dryers</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Manual wash systems - Wash tub</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Detergent</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Clothesline and pins or dry rack</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Laundry baskets/bags</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> <a href="#">Portable laundry trailers</a></li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> Off grid hand powered or low voltage (solar power) wash systems</li> </ul>
